



SPORT PREMIUM 2014 – 2015



The Government is spending over £450 million on improving Physical Education and sport in primary schools over 3 academic years beginning in 2013.

Below is an overview of how much money we will receive, how we will spend it, and what we anticipate the impact to be.

Amount of Sport Premium allocated to us for the academic year 2014-2015	£8,853 (£8,000 sum plus £5 per child)
We are using this funding to:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Continue with another yearlong service level agreement with Nene Park Academy for their Sports Offer. This includes: weekly team teaching/modelling fro PE dept, subject leader support, Ofsted guidance, Quality Mark advice, CPD sessions, inter and intra school sports events/ competitions. • Contribute towards swimming provision to ensure all children achieve end of Key stage 2 expected level. • Employ a specialist PE teaching coach to work with/model to teacher during PE lessons • Improve the quality of PE during enrichment sessions. • Contribute towards sports coaches to increase our number of after-school sports clubs encouraging more children to attend (street dance, fencing, gymnastics) • Purchase new sports equipment for lunch/break time provision. 	
Measuring the impact of our actions:	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The quality of our PE lessons is good and the range of sports covered as part of our curriculum is now broader. • More after-school clubs covering a wider range of sports are on offer to the children. • The number of children attending sports based after-school clubs has increased. • More children are engaged in physical activities at lunchtime. • Children are participating in more competitive sport against other schools.
