SPORT PREMIUM STATEMENT 2015 – 2016



What is 'Sport Premium' funding?

In April 2013, the Government announced new funding of £150 million for Physical Education (PE) and Sport – often referred to as a 'Sport Premium'. This funding is to be used to improve the quality and breadth of PE and Sport provision in schools.

For the academic year 2015-2016, our funding will be £9,045.

Current Provision

We are proud of the current PE curriculum provision at our school and of the wealth of extra-curricular opportunities that we provide for our pupils. Our teachers work alongside PE specialists from Nene Park Academy to plan and team-teach weekly PE lessons and we employ a specialist sports coach who works one day a week in school to enrich our sports provision. Sporting Clubs include football, netball, street dance, gymnastics and multi sports. Our football and netball teams compete regularly with other schools and our half-termly inter-house sporting competitions encourage all children to participate in a wide range of competitive sporting activities including ultimate frisbee, dodgeball, benchball, and tri golf .

All children in Years 5 and 6 take a course of at least 10 swimming lessons. Children in Years 3 and 4 currently have 3 taster swimming sessions.
