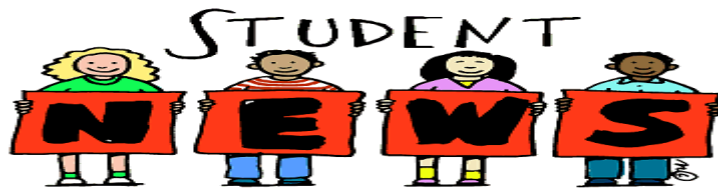




# St Augustine's Junior

## Pathway Resurfacing (13<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> March) - gates closure

The pathway leading from the access gate at St. Augustine's church through to the top of the steps leading to Brewster Avenue Infant School will be resurfaced week commencing 13<sup>th</sup> March. The resurfacing will take approximately 5 days and as a consequence access through these 2 gates will not be possible as from 9am Monday 13<sup>th</sup> March for the **whole** school week. Full access through these gates will resume (outside of school hours when the gates are locked for the safeguarding of our children) Monday 20<sup>th</sup> March. We appreciate this may cause considerable inconvenience to some parents, carers and children as these works are undertaken. However, due to the nature of the funding that has been offered to the school, this work must be completed before the end of March. Therefore, all access to the school during this week **MUST** be through the main entrance off Palmerston Road. Please allow more time in the mornings and at school pick up time to drop off and collect your children if this impacts on you directly. The pathway which runs alongside Tesco and the Church around the outside perimeter of the school is still open to public access. If you have any queries or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the school.

### **Music Lessons**

As a school, we strongly support the musical development of our children and currently offer private fee-paying music lessons (hosted in school) in the violin, saxophone, flute, clarinet, drumming, guitar and piano. For those children who have loaned instruments from the Peterborough Music Hub, please remember to bring them to school on the day of the music lesson. The timetable for music lessons currently is:

Monday (afternoon) - Violin

Wednesday (morning) - Saxophone/ clarinet/ flute/ piano

Wednesday (afternoon) - Guitar/ drumming

Please be aware that as from the Summer Term 2017, there will be a slight price increase in the charge for music tuition in the wind and strings instrument. Since starting private music tuition in January 2014, the length of the music lesson has increased and the number of children per group has dropped. Therefore, the children are receiving greater value for money whilst the school is now in a position where music lessons are subsidised directly by the school which is not sustainable. Parents and carers impacted upon will be communicated with directly.

If you are interested in your child having private music tuition at school, please contact the School Office where we will try and accommodate you.

### **Lunchtime Play**

With spring fast approaching we will be hoping for some warmer and dryer weather! This allows us to open the school field to the children during lunchtime and gives them a larger space to burn off some energy during the school day. As before we will be asking the children to change their shoes before going onto the field and so can you please ensure that your child has a suitable pair of shoes available at school.
