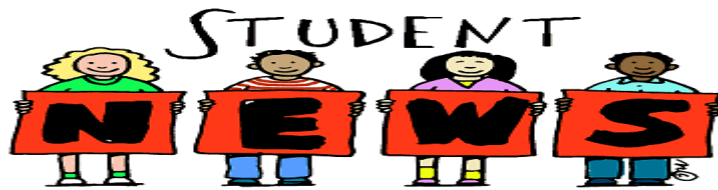




# St Augustine's Junior
