School Meals

We have been with our new supplier, Aspens, for 8 weeks now and so far the feedback on the quality of the meals has been very positive. The majority of parents have now registered their online account and are using the system correctly, however there is still a number of you that haven't quite got the hang of it! If you would like any assistance with using Select then please visit the school office. You must ensure your child has sufficient credits on their account and you must log on regularly to ensure that you have specifically requested a meal on ALL of the days they require one. We still have a handful of children that are expecting a school meal at lunchtime without their parents ordering the meal on Select and we cannot continue to facilitate this. **With effect from Monday, if your child's school meal has not been pre-ordered on Select, they will be asked to wait until all the other children have been served before they can have their meal.** This could potentially mean that they will not get their first preference of meal or be able to sit with their friendship group so I cannot stress enough the importance of ordering your child's meals correctly. Once again, please speak to the school office if you need any assistance.
