Pay HLTA to support "Bikeability" sessions across school (supported by Sustrans)	£1,500	Increase proficiency of cycling across the school, ensuring that more children are able to enjoy cycling safely.	£1,500	11 children who previously couldn't ride a bike can now successfully ride and have enjoyed the use of bikes within school over 15 sessions.

Play therapy provision ended in July due to school being awarded Lottery Funding for weekly NLPKids sessions. A small number of YMCA Play Therapy credits have been carried over and could be topped up for use in future if required.

Release Eco lead and Learning Mentor one afternoon per week to run Forest Schools with Lower School children.	£4,000	Forest Schools will give children opportunities to learn a range of skills, develop independence and cooperation.	£3,950	Forest School sessions have enabled children at St A's to gain a love of outdoor learning and have developed skills in communication and team work. Pupil surveys evidence an increased awareness of the environment and human impact on it.
Employ a specialist sports coach to provide enriching gymnastics coaching and upskilling teaching of gymnastics across school.	£2,300	All children will have the opportunity to receive high quality gymnastics instruction additional to PE provision.	£2,440	Confidence in the teaching of gymnastics has improved. All children have developed gymnastics skills. Around 32 signed up for after school gymnastics club.
