Provide enrichment opportunities for all children across the year by experienced sports coach	£2,280	Children will be offered the opportunity to try new sports, not usually part of PE provision.	£2,470	Table Tennis started as a weekly lunchtime drop-in session run by an experienced table tennis coach - approximately 45-50 children attended. This then developed into a weekly after-school club to allow more time to develop skills. Gymnastics was also offered as an after-school club. 25 pupil premium children benefitted from these after-school opportunities funded by Sports Premium.
Purchase Forest School tools, waterproof trousers.	£1,000	Forest School will give children opportunities to learn a range of skills including cooperation and communication and will become more independent in outdoor learning.	£1,467	Forest School sessions have enabled children at St A's to gain a love of outdoor learning and have developed skills in communication and team work. Pupil surveys evidence an increased awareness of the environment and human impact on it. Equipment purchased (fire pits, waterproof clothing, den-building equipment, tools, binoculars etc) has enabled children to be taught survival skills. Due to start Autumn 19.
