

### Learning for Next Week

w/c 28 <sup>th</sup> Sept	Literacy	Maths
<b>Lower School</b>	The children will be starting their Topic work on the Stone Age leading to the Bronze Age. They will be using the WAGOLL (What a good one looks like) to explore the features of a set of instructions. They will be using the instructions to make a clay pot in forest school and 'Talk for Writing' to help them learn the instructions through actions and pictures, as well as investigate different types of punctuation.	Along with daily arithmetic sessions and timetable practise, the children will begin their place value unit, where they will be given the opportunity to explore sequences, counting in multiples as well as identifying different values in numbers.
<b>Upper School</b>	We will be starting our topic on World War 2. We will focus on the different, important roles that were played by all British people during the war. Our first writing unit will be a journalistic recount (newspaper report); the children will begin to research and collate information before writing their own journalistic recount on the outbreak of WW2.	The children in both Year 5 and 6 will start with the place value unit. They will be given a variety of fluency questions as well as problem solving questions as they identify different values in numbers. In addition to this, the children will complete daily arithmetic and timetable sessions.
