Provide enrichment opportunities for all children across the year by experienced sports coach	£3,500	Children will be offered the opportunity to try new sports, extra to our PE provision.
Purchase Forest School resources and equipment.	£2,000	Forest School will be extended to provide weekly sessions for all year groups in 20-21 led by a full time qualified FS teacher. Outdoor learning will be planned to enrich and consolidate the ‘catch-up’ curriculum as well as providing opportunities to learn a range of skills including independence, cooperation and communication. All children will also have the opportunity to learn vital first aid skills.
Learning Mentor one morning per week to support Forest School	£1,800	Learning Mentor will support our most vulnerable pupils during Forest School sessions so that they can take part alongside their peers.
