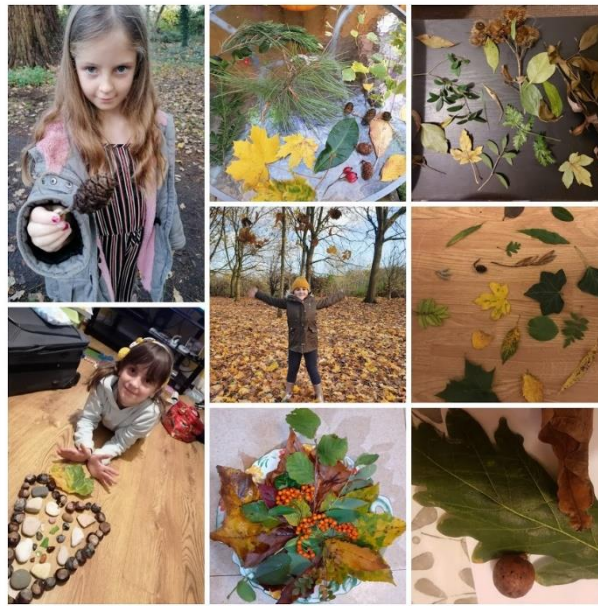

Learning for Next Week

w/c 23 rd Nov	Literacy	Maths
Lower School	<p>After completing assessments this week, the children are going to continue the non-chronological report work that they started. They will be exploring different sentence structures and how to vary their sentence types to impact upon the reader. The children will focus their understanding of sentence structure around the research they collected last week. As well as this, they will be investigating different punctuation and manipulating how best to use it for effect.</p>	<p>Year 3 - the children will be moving on from adding using a mental partitioning method and learn how to use the formal method to add larger, more complex numbers. This is brand new learning for Year 3 and will involve lots of practising and exploring.</p> <p>Year 4 - the children will also be revisiting the formal method for addition, which they learnt in Year 3. They will complete a range of problem solving and reasoning questions to master their understanding of the method</p>
Upper School	<p>Upper School will begin a new unit on narrative writing. As with all writing units, the first lessons will consist of the children completing a mini-write to show their teachers what they already know about this unit of writing before reading and analysing the WAGOLL (What A Good One Looks Like). The children will then be taught how dialogue can move the action on in a narrative and also how senses can be used to create effective descriptive writing.</p>	<p>Year 5 - will learn how to use mental and written methods of division. This will involve looking back at this week's assessment papers to identify any gaps as well as practise both methods in fluency and problem solving questions.</p> <p>Year 6 - will start the fractions unit by first understanding how to simplify and convert fractions. They will practise these skills by applying taught knowledge to fluency and problem solving questions too. Both year groups will continue with daily arithmetic and times table practise too.</p>
